We collaborate since 2004 with Dr. Aruna, the founder of our counterpart RHEST, addressing the problem of the pelvic organ prolapse..

Gynecologists of WfW also operate on women for pelvic organ prolapse with Nepalese gynecologists who are trained by us. Operations are performed only when absolutely unavoidable. They are conducted in well equipped hospitals to a high standard. Surgery soon takes one and half hour. Our gynecologists performt for 4 to 6 operations per day. Aftercare takes at least five days

This article shows how necessary it is that the Nepalese are well trained in the indications for surgery, the responsibility of performing these operations and the importance of aftercare.
